Message from the Head

This half term has been full of activity, learning, and opportunities across the school.

We've welcomed several new children and families from Nursery through to Year 6. It's been lovely to see them settling in and becoming part of our school community.

Our Meet the Teacher events gave families a chance to connect with staff and learn more about the year ahead. We also held a Support Your Child with Phonics evening, which offered practical advice for supporting early reading at home.

Parents joined us for Forest School Inspire sessions, experiencing first-hand the benefits of outdoor learning and exploration.

We were proud to host a Macmillan Coffee Morning, which welcomed not only parents but members of the wider community. It was a fantastic event that raised funds for a great cause while bringing people together.

Hollywood came to Newtown to capture everyday moments that reflect the ethos and energy of our school, and we were thrilled to share our school video with families and the wider community.

Children took part in music workshops, explored faith and culture during a trip to Liverpool's Synagogue and Cathedral, and enjoyed a field trip to Ellesmere, linking classroom learning with real-world experiences.

Year 6 took part in the Enterprise Challenge at Thomas Adams, developing teamwork and entrepreneurial skills in a new setting. We also welcomed a pilot, who

spoke to pupils about his career and inspired lots of questions and curiosity.

As did our Year 5 & 6 webinar with astronaut Tim Peake who spoke about space as part of their literacy work.

Our football teams had a brilliant half term, playing several matches and winning three tournaments—a fantastic achievement that reflects their hard work and team spirit.

We ended the term with a well-attended Harvest Festival, celebrating community and giving thanks.

Last year we went to Theatre Severn in Shrewsbury but a number of children didn't go due to visiting with their family so we're back to Wales this year!

The cost, as with everything, has risen substantially and it now costs just short of £2000 for the school to visit. (£930 coach and £960 tickets) which works out at approximately £25 per head. To reduce the cost for parents, the Friends of Newtown will make a significant contribution but this year we will also be doing a Sponsored Bounce!

All money raised will go towards subsidising the trip and then we will work out a cost per head which should be significantly lower than the current £25 per child.

Every family has today received information and sponsorship form for the ‘Bounce for the Panto’ event which will take place on November 20th. Please get round those wider family members to see how much we can raise!
