Message from the Head

We are pleased to share how spirituality continues to grow at Newtown Church of England Primary School. Rooted in our vision Growing together in strength, love and wisdom, we shine, spirituality shapes how we learn, live and support one another.

Spirituality at Newtown is for everyone – children, staff, families and our wider community. It is the deepening of our relationships with ourselves, others, the world and something greater than ourselves. To make this meaningful for pupils, we will use a simple shared language: In, Out, Up.

What It Means

IN – Looking Inward

Helping children understand who they are - their thoughts and feelings – which builds inner strength, confidence, reflection and emotional awareness.

OUT – Looking Outward

Focusing on relationships and our place in the world which develops empathy, kindness, respect for diversity and responsibility for community and creation.

UP – Looking Upward and Beyond

Encouraging awe, wonder and exploration of bigger questions which includes our Christian values and openness to faith and mystery.

This shared language helps all pupils recognise and express spiritual moments in age-appropriate ways.

Why Spirituality Matters

Through this approach, children grow in resilience, wisdom, empathy, creativity and joy – helping every child shine.

How This Looks in School Life

Teachers plan for awe, wonder and big questions in all subjects - from ethical discussions and debate to creativity in the arts and curiosity in science.

Our In, Out, Up model guides daily worship, reflecting on Christian values, hearing Bible stories and exploring life's joys and challenges.

Spirituality is lived out through kindness, restorative approaches, celebrations of uniqueness and valuing each person.

Classrooms include reflection areas, with wider school displays encouraging prayer, stillness and spiritual exploration.

A Spirituality That Helps Everyone Flourish

Our approach supports the wellbeing and growth of the whole school community. By embedding In, Out, Up in all aspects of school life, Newtown continues to be a place where everyone feels valued, supported and inspired to grow in strength, love and wisdom.



School Holidays in Term Time

I would like to remind all families about the rules surrounding term-time holidays and the responsibilities that schools have in enforcing government attendance guidance.

As a school, we fully understand that family time is important and that holiday costs can rise significantly outside of term dates. Taking a break is something we all value. However, government legislation is very clear that headteachers may only authorise term-time leave in *exceptional circumstances*. Family holidays, for whatever reason, do not meet this threshold.

Because of this, any unauthorised holiday taken during term time may result in a fixed penalty notice issued to parents or carers. This is not something we want to do,

but it is something the school is legally required to enforce.

Each term, our school is visited by the Education Welfare Officer, who carefully monitors attendance and checks that we are following national guidance. As part of this process, attendance patterns and unauthorised absences are reviewed. Where persistent or significant unauthorised absence is identified, the school must take action.

We would much rather work with families to avoid these situations. Excellent attendance ensures that your child does not miss valuable learning and helps them to feel settled and confident in school. If you are experiencing difficulties that may affect your child's attendance, please speak with us as early as possible so we can help.

Photography Club Weekly Winner


This week's winner is Elsie Roberts.

This photograph transforms a simple stand of winter trees into a striking study of upward movement and quiet drama. By choosing a low, skyward angle, Elsie turns the trunks into towering columns, their textured bark rising like the pillars of a natural cathedral. The branching limbs, stark against the vivid blue sky, form an intricate lattice that feels both delicate and purposeful.

Light and negative space work together to create depth, with the bright sky illuminating the fine tracery of branches as though painted in ink. The unusual perspective invites the viewer to look *through* the trees rather than *at* them, capturing a sense of curiosity and awe. In doing so, Elsie elevates an ordinary subject into something contemplative, architectural, and quietly majestic.
