

*THANK YOU so much. We truly appreciate your support for Whitchurch Food Bank. Please pass on our sincere thanks to all the pupils who supported your appeal, and of course to mums and dads too!*

*It doesn't seem long since we had such amazing support from schools, churches, and chapels following their Harvest celebrations, which helped to restock our emptying shelves. Sadly, donations from Whitchurch supermarkets – Tesco and Sainsbury's – dropped by 20% over the past year, as have donations from the general public. This suggests that many families are still struggling with the continuing rise in the cost of living, and as a result, donations have fallen. That's why we were so delighted by the generosity at Harvest – it truly was a time of giving!*

*Thanks to the incredible support from our community, we were able to deliver food to 70 families (117 adults and 167 children) recommended to us by local schools over the festive period. This was only possible because of the kindness and generosity of people like you. We have so much to be thankful for!*

*Our motto at Foodbank is – "Never forget, that every item we receive makes a world of difference to someone in despair, and we cannot thank you enough for standing with us."*
