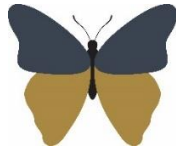

Message from the Head

We are pleased to share how spirituality continues to grow at Welshampton Church of England Primary School. Rooted in our vision Growing together in strength, love and wisdom, we shine, spirituality shapes how we learn, live and support one another.

Spirituality at Welshampton is for everyone – children, staff, families and our wider community. It is the deepening of our relationships with ourselves, others, the world and something greater than ourselves. To make this meaningful for pupils, we will use a simple shared language: In, Out, Up.

What It Means

IN – Looking Inward

Helping children understand who they are - their thoughts and feelings – which builds inner strength, confidence, reflection and emotional awareness.

OUT – Looking Outward

Focusing on relationships and our place in the world which develops empathy, kindness, respect for diversity and responsibility for community and creation.

UP – Looking Upward and Beyond

Encouraging awe, wonder and exploration of bigger questions which includes our Christian values and openness to faith and mystery.

This shared language helps all pupils recognise and express spiritual moments in age-appropriate ways.

Why Spirituality Matters

Through this approach, children grow in resilience, wisdom, empathy, creativity and joy – helping every child shine.

How This Looks in School Life

Teachers plan for awe, wonder and big questions in all subjects - from ethical discussions and debate to creativity in the arts and curiosity in science.

Our In, Out, Up model guides daily worship, reflecting on Christian values, hearing Bible stories and exploring life's joys and challenges.

Spirituality is lived out through kindness, restorative approaches, celebrations of uniqueness and valuing each person.

Classrooms include reflection areas, with wider school displays encouraging prayer, stillness and spiritual exploration.

A Spirituality That Helps Everyone Flourish

Our approach supports the wellbeing and growth of the whole school community. By embedding In, Out, Up in all aspects of school life, Welshampton continues to be a place where everyone feels valued, supported and inspired to grow in strength, love and wisdom.

Examples:

- If your word is magical, you might come as a *fairy* or *wizard*.
- If your word is brave, you could wear a *cape* or *shield*.
- If your word is sparkly, you might add *glittery accessories*.
- If your word is sleepy, pyjamas work perfectly!

This is a fun and creative way to build vocabulary while avoiding pressure to buy costumes.
