Year 4 Curriculum Overview

ENGLISH





In our English unit this half term, we shall begin by reading Puss in Boots, a version written by Michael Morpurgo.

We shall develop our own story writing skills and write a version of the story using our own characters and Year 4 writing expectations. These will include; Fronted adverbials for time and place, standard English, inverted commas and noun phrases.

We shall then move on to reading and performing The Pied Piper of Hamelin by Robert Browning.

MATHS



This half term we shall be building on the work we completed in the Autumn term on multiplication and division. We shall recognise how these operations are inverses and how multiplication is commutative. We shall develop use of written strategies to help us multiply and divide.

National Curriculum links include:


Recognise and use factor pairs and commutativity in mental calculations. Recall multiplication and division facts for multiplication tables up to 12×12 Multiply and divide whole numbers and those involving decimals by 10, 100 and 1,000 (Y5)

Solve problems involving multiplying and adding, including using the distributive law to multiply 2-digit numbers by I digit, integer scaling problems and harder correspondence problems such as n objects are connected to m objects.

Multiply 2-digit and 3-digit numbers by a 1-digit number using formal written layout.

Use place value, known and derived facts to multiply and divide mentally, including: multiplying by 0 and 1; dividing by 1; multiplying together 3 numbers.

SCIENCE



This half term we focus on magnets and forces. We shall classify materials, investigate magnet strength and predict whether two magnets will attract or repel. We

shall end our learning by designing and making our own game using our knowledge of magnets. **HISTORY** In our history learning this half term, we shall be finding out about the Ancient Egyptian civilisation. We shall learn that; The Ancient Egyptian civilisation was in North Africa and was successful due to the richness offered by the River Nile. The River Nile was very important because it supported farming to help feed the population. The Nile allowed them to use boats to trade or battle. The Ancient Egyptian civilisation lasted from around 3100 BCE to 30 BCE when the Romans conquered it. Howard Carter was a meticulous archaeologist who discovered Tutankhamun's tomb in 1922. Tutankhamun's tomb was the first tomb to be discovered that had been untouched by thieves. Artefacts from Tutankhamun's tomb have allowed us to learn a great deal about the Ancient Egyptians. The Ancient Egyptians worshiped many gods who they believed would judge them when they died. They believed that they would live on in the afterlife. In this topic, we think about different communities and how they work. In the local church, lay people of all ages are called to undertake various roles called ministries by virtues of their Baptism and Confirmation. They help to build up the local community of the parish. **Scripture:** Romans 12:4-6 We have many parts in the one body, and all these parts have different functions ...we are many, we are one body in union with Christ ...we are use our different gifts in accordance with the grace that God has given us. **MUSIC** On Wednesday afternoons in Year 4, we begin to enjoy learning the ukulele with Mr Taylor-Fleming from the Lancashire Music Service. We shall build upon the skills taught in Year 3, learn new chords, play along to different genres of music and compose simple melodies. **ART** In our art unit this half term, we shall develop colour mixing skills, using shades and tints to show form and create three dimensions when painting.
