British Values spotlight on:

Democracy and Mutual Respect

Democracy is a core British value that emphasizes participation, representation, and accountability in governance, forming the foundation of civic life in the UK.

Democracy is a way of making decisions where everyone's voice matters. It means people are given the chance to share their opinions, listen to others, and take part in voting or choosing together. In school, democracy helps children learn to express their ideas, respect different views, and understand that decisions are often made by the majority while still being fair to everyone.

Mutual respect, as part of British values, involves acknowledging and valuing the differences in beliefs, faiths, cultures, and lifestyles without imposing your own views on others. It does not require agreement with others' opinions or practices but emphasizes listening, fairness, and kindness in interactions with people from diverse backgrounds.
