As **writers**, we will use our class texts, (Duck in the Truck, The best Diwali ever) to write labels and lists. We will also write our name.

For **handwriting** we are using the 'Pick and Flip' method to hold our pencil in the correct pincer grip. We are also practising the correct formation of our RWI letters using different mediums.

As **readers** we, will recognise, write and blend words with the Read, Write, Inc set 1 speed sounds. We will also play different 'Fred Talk' games to help us blend sounds orally.

We will develop our love of reading by sharing stories, creating and acting out events, investigating characters through drama and accessing the reading area.

As **communicators** our children will have many opportunities in their learning, play and social interactions to develop their communication and language skills.

As **mathematicians** we follow the 'Mastering Number Programme' and we will:

Subitise arrangements of the numbers 1 to 5

Know numbers 1 to 5 are made of different parts

Compare two sets saying which is more than / fewer than

Use Numberblocks (from the BBC) to support our learning of numbers.

Children will explore 2D and 3D shapes to create pictures and patterns.

Will compose and decompose shapes.

Transport - Past & Present

As geographers we will:

Find out about transport in our local area, share our own experiences of going on a journey on different types of transport and know about safe travelling and road safety.


We will know how people from different cultures travel; (Tuk Tuk, Bullet, Gondola) and locate these countries on a map.

As **historians** we will:

Learn about Remembrance Day through stories as well as learn a song and create artwork for Church.

Identify different forms of land, air and sea transport in the past and present.

Find out about Ernest Shackleton the explorer.



We will also learn about Diwali through story and crafts.

Our Christian value for this half term is 'peace and thankfulness'.



As **Artists**, **Creators** and **Performers** we will:

Children will use their skills of junk modelling from last half term to create to design and create a boat. They will then test if they float or sink.

This half term children will explore painting with different types of media such as folks and Cotton buds to create a range of textures and affects. Afterwards they will apply these skills to create Christmas cards and calendars for family members.



All children will have the opportunity to travel to the pantomime and watch the performance.

As **Musicians** we will be listening carefully to and appraising a range of different music.

In **life skills**, children will learn and explore why families and special people are valuable. Looking at the importance of sharing and developing strategies to build friendships.

As **scientists** we will:

Explore the forces of push, pull and twist and investigate objects which float and sink.

Look for signs of winter.

Explore how ice, snow, frost changes in the warmth and how water freezes.

Our **Scientific skills** of observation, asking questions and using new vocabulary as we talk about our new knowledge, will be developed as we look for signs of winter using our senses and investigate forces.



How can I help my child?

Read with your child as often as you can. Sharing books will be changed weekly. Ask your child questions about the book you have shared, including characters, events and favourite parts. Remember to explain any words which are unfamiliar to your child.

Sing songs and Nursery Rhymes with him/her.

Practise recognising the letter sounds sent home and put them together to 'Fred Talk' then blend into simple 2 and 3 letter words.

Encourage your child to count objects and look for numbers and shapes in the environment.

Practise the correct formation of letters and numbers.
