As **Mathematicians**, we will continue to develop our 2, 5 and 10 times table knowledge.

At the beginning of this half term, we will be continuing with addition and subtraction within 10.

We will then be moving on to place value for number 11 to 20.

At the end of this half term, we will be looking at coin recognition:

The children will be able to count in groups of 2, 5 and 10.

We will be able to recognise and know the value of different coins.

Explain that a single coin can be worth several pennies.

The children will be able to use their knowledge of the value of the coins to solve problems.

Children will then relate what they have learnt to real life contexts.

As **Geographers**, we will be finding out all about The Seven Continents.

We will know that continents are very large areas of land and that oceans are large areas of water.

We will be able to identify the poles and the equator.

We will know that the continents are diverse.

We will recognise Europe as one of the world's seven continents.



As **Historians**, we will be able to:

We will know that William and Mary made an important promise and that they signed the Bill of Rights 1689.

We will know that Parliament discuss and make decisions about our country.

We will know that the Prime Minister is in charge of our government.

How can I help my child?

Read with your child as often as you can to develop fluency and asking questions such as 'why does the character feel that way? What clue tells you that?'

Practise high frequency words and spellings together –in preparation for our spelling test every Monday morning.

Practise the 2, 5 and 10 times tables.

Every half term, children develop their science 'working scientifically' skills. This half term children will investigate and:

Know how to observe closely, using simple equipment.

Know how to identify and classify.

Know how to use observations and ideas to suggest answers to questions.


As **Scientists** we will be investigation and finding out all about plants.
