## CRIME AND PUNISHMENT-YEAR 5 AND 6

These activities can be done in any order. You may like to do one every other week. Bring any completed activities into school to share with the class.

- 1. Design or build your own courtroom. Think about what the inside of a courtroom looks like (we will see one at the Galleries of Justice) and how you could present it. Will you simply draw it or go one step further and physically make it using imaginative resources e.g. Papier-mâché or lego.
- 2. Graffiti art or crime? Write a balanced argument detailing why graffiti could be perceived as both art and crime. You may want to research famous graffiti artists such as Banksy to help inform your writing.
- 3. Write a diary entry. Imagine you are the famous detective Sherlock Holmes and write a diary entry about a crime you have just solved with your trustee companion, Watson.
- 4. Imagine you are in charge of the country and write a set of laws. Include what punishments you would include for the breaking of your laws!
