Survivors	The people who lived.
Lighthouse	A tower or structure containing a beacon of light to warn or guide ships at sea
Lifeboat	A specially constructed boat launched from land to rescue people in distress at sea
RNLI	A charity which saves lives at sea. It has over 300 lifeboats and additional hovercraft.
Heroine	a woman admired for her courage, outstanding achievements, or noble qualities
Chronological	A record of events-following the passing of time

Key knowledge

Grace Darling and her dad received a silver medal for bravery from the RNLI

The first lighthouse was built in Egypt over 2000 years ago.

The RNLI (Royal National Lifeboat institution) was formed in 1824.

Grace Darling rowed out to the shipwreck of the SS Forfarshire and rescued 9 survivors from the rocks.

Grace Darling was born in 1815.
