Head lice and Nits

Every so often, we have to deal with outbreaks of nits and headlice in class.

Head lice infections occur quite commonly among children. While many people may react to this with feelings of disgust, head lice are in fact passed from person to person irrespective of standards of hygiene and cleanliness. Many parents naturally wish for an immediate and guaranteed cure to the problem. The truth is that none exists.

As parents, you can help prevent head lice infections by checking your child's hair **weekly** with a head lice detector comb. If a family member does have an infection, please inform any contact (including adults) so that they can check their hair, as well as informing the school, nursery or playgroup. If your child has an infection, please ensure that treatment is started as soon as possible.
