Seedlings

We read the story of Goldilocks and the Three Bears. In the home corner we made porridge and talked about hot and cold. We also had a visit from Narla the chicken. The children loved stroking her and making the sounds of a chicken.

We were impressed with how high the children can jump and how confident they were at taking risks. We listened really carefully to Miss Crossley as she explained where chickens come from and what they eat.
