Safeguarding Spot: Fortnite Online Gaming

As a school we are seeing an increasing number of children searching for Fortnite related materials in school and felt it would be helpful to share some useful information and suggested measures of how to keep children safe.



'Fortnite - Battle Royale.' is a free to play section of the game 'Fortnite.' The game sees 100 players dropped on to an island from a 'battle bus,' where they have to compete until one survivor remains. The last remaining player on the island wins the game. Players have to find hidden items, such as weapons, to help them survive longer in the game.
