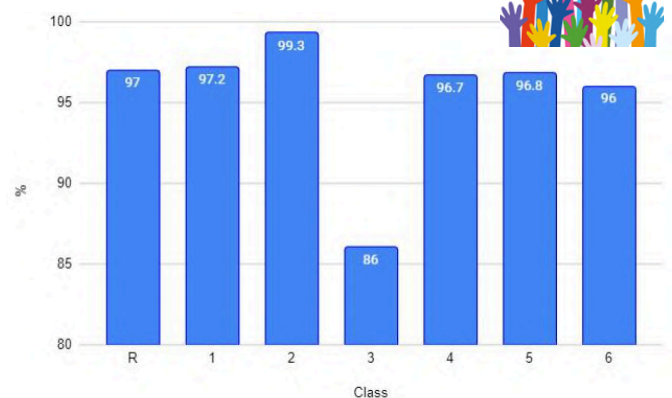

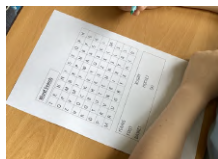


Year 6 Languages Event

Year 6 enjoyed a visit from some of the CHHS languages teaching team and students on Thursday afternoon. This was a great opportunity to enhance our Modern Foreign Languages curriculum.

They completed a range of activities in groups and got the chance to practise the skills developed through KS2, in particular their listening and speaking skills.

Year 5 'Living Habitats' Workshop

On Tuesday, Year 5 were once again lucky enough to attend CHS to experience a workshop about Living Habitats. This was a fun and immersive session that allowed the children to discover many insects and creatures that can live in ponds. Using microscopes and magnifying glasses, the children were able to classify the creatures they found with the aid of decision flow charts, categorising them into different groups. It was amazing how many differing species they identified.
