
Have a fantastic summer and we look forward to working together again from September.

End of Year Evaluation

The end of an academic year, despite it coming around so quickly, is always a great opportunity to reflect on the achievements of the year; and there have been many!

- We have researched, created and implemented a new approach to teaching reading comprehension skills to children once they have completed Read, Write, Inc Phonics Programme.
- We have improved our offer for children who speak English as an additional language and now have an effective system to track their progress.
- We have implemented a new approach to handwriting and spelling and are seeing fantastic impact.
- We have developed a new approach to the teaching of writing, ensuring high quality texts provide a variety of engaging purposes and audiences for writing.
- We have developed our graduated offer to support children with Social, Emotional and Mental Health needs.
- We have developed an effective and efficient marking and feedback policy based on the latest EEF research and takes into consideration teacher workload.
- We have evaluated and made improvements to our PSHE curriculum which has included the implementation of the use of One Decision.
- We have consulted with all stakeholders and developed a new vision and values for our school. This will be implemented next year and shared with you at the start of September.
- Implemented a whole new curriculum in Nursery and Reception called Narrative Immersion. The success of this has been so great we are now developing this into Year 1.

To say I am proud of all of our achievements is an understatement and would like to say a very large thank you to our whole staff team.

This is usually the time of year that I would send out a parental survey to seek views about this year and potential lines of enquiry for further improvement. However, due to our Inspection this week that has now been received. Thank you to all those who found time to complete this.
