


Weekly Attendance

School Meals

Taylor Shaw, who are responsible for our school meals, have carried out an annual review of catering costs. This review has been based on several key factors:-

· The uplift to the national minimum wage

The new legislation regarding national insurance
Food inflation, which is forecasted to be 4.2%.
These factors have resulted in a considerable increase to their costs and as a consequence the price per meal will increase to £2.90 from 1st April 2025. I apologise for the inconvenience this may cause and hope the notice period I have provided gives parents enough time to consider how they wish to proceed.
I do continually monitor the appearance and quality of food being served in our kitchen and seek feedback from the children as to their opinions to ensure your money is well spent.
