




Assembly Focus of the Week: Equality

Every Year in Year 4 the children take part in a national Multiplication test. They are asked 25 questions linked to their 2-12 times tables and have 6 seconds to answer. This year the children were really excited and confident to show how hard they had been working and we are delighted to share that we have achieved the highest scores in the history of this test at Thorn Grove with the average score being 23.7. Year 4 we are all really proud of you and this will help you so much as you move into Year 5.
