Nursery Rhymes (One focus rhyme per week)



Reading

This half term we will be looking at lots of books about ourselves and families.

Writing

- Children will be encouraged to start making writing style marks using a variety of different materials.
- Children will begin to practise tracing their name during every session.
- Children will be developing their ability to make marks and discuss what they mean.

Personal, Social, Emotional Development



- Children will be learning to self-select activities and use resources with help when needed.
- Children will be introduced to Nursery rules and routines, and increasingly be able to follow these.
- Children will be developing the ability to take turns with adults and other children in provision.

Communication & Language

- Children will be practising a wide range of nursery rhymes and are encouraged to share these at home.
- Children will be listening carefully to environmental sounds and talking about what they can hear.
- Children will be encouraged to widen their vocabulary. Adults in setting will support this by encouraging children to speak in full sentences where possible.

Physical Development



- Children will be developing their movement, balancing, throwing and catching skills.
- Children will be practising scissor skills using one-handed tools and equipment

Expressive Arts & Design

- There will be lots of opportunities for the children to use materials freely.
- Children will be supported to cut, stick and join materials in order to turn their ideas into models.
- Children will be encouraged to create large models in the ourdoor area.
- Children will be encouraged to create shelters by den building.
- As a class will also explore a variety of instruments and talk about the different sounds that they make

Understanding the World

- We will be using our senses to explore natural materials, both indoors and outdoors
- We will begin to make sense of our own life story learning 'All about Me'
- We will continue to develop positive attitudes about the differences between people, and explore what makes each of us special.

Maths

Colours, Sorting and Pattern

- We will focus on sorting and matching familiar objects, mainly by colour and leading onto making recognisable patterns. For example, blue yellow, blue -yellow.
- We will sing and learn number songs and rhymes, and incorporate the beginnings of early number within our play on a daily basis; e.g. making cakes with playdough, laying the table for tea, counting out the cups for snack.
- Through our continuous provision, we will talk about the size of objects and compare them.

Home Learning

- Children will receive a weekly home learning sheet which will allow you to share and continue their learning at home.
- We encourage parents to read a variety of books and stories at home and create a healthy bedtime routine.
 Children can borrow books from school to share at home and these can be changed as often as desired.
