- Encourage your child's growing independence by allowing them to come in each morning on their own and sort out their own belongings
- Listening them to read their home readers for a short period each night and ask them questions to clarify their understanding of what has been read
- Supporting them with their weekly spellings homework
- Looking out for information about our topics on the website and encouraging you r child to continue learning at home.

## **Uniform and Equipment**

Your child's reading book should be in school every day. They will be given a book changing day where they will receive two new books.

### Knowledge Organisers

Knowledge organisers will be posted on our website to give you an overview of what we will be learning about in different subjects.

This will help to connect school and home and provide a great starting point for carrying out additional research and work at home.

### Homework

Please encourage and support your child with their homework. Each week, they will have a list of spellings to learn linked to their daily phonics sessions. Children are also expected to read each night. Books should be discussed and questions asked to develop comprehension skills.
