



## Reception Home Learning Tasks – Autumn Two

**Weekly Activities:** Reading daily, phonics homework and year group spellings, number bonds or times table practise. Blue boxes are compulsory, white boxes optional.

Record your homework grid pieces in this book. Feel free to be creative! Use colours, IT or photographs to present your work.

<p><b>Can you play sound eye spy?</b> Around the house or outside can you play eye spy using initial sounds Eye spy something beginning with 'b' bed. You could choose one sound and find as many things as you can beginning with that sound.</p> 	<p><b>Storytime</b> Listen to a story read by someone else. You could ask someone new to read you a story such as an Aunty or family friend, or you could watch a bedtime story on CBeebies.</p> 	<p><b>Counting picture</b> Can you draw a picture with: 1 pond 2 trees 3 ducks 4 children 5 flowers</p> 
<p><b>Family traditions</b> During festive seasons families often spend time together. Can you think about family traditions you may do.  You could draw a picture of you doing something you enjoy with your family.</p> 	<p><b>Christmas list</b> Have fun writing a list to Santa. You can either write it or cut pictures out of toy catalogues. Children could practice using scissors and cutting out themselves.</p> 	<p><b>Autumn art</b> Collect autumn objects and make some art! It could be a leaf hedgehog, a conker bug or a autumn collage of colours. Be imaginative!</p> 
<p><b>Autumn walk</b> Can you go on a walk and investigate what is happening to the trees and leaves. What colours can you see? You could collect some autumn objects.</p> 	<p><b>Decorate a festive tree</b> TopMarks online have a fun game where you can decorate a festive tree. You could make biscuits, cakes or other tasty treats. Give your child simple instructions and ask them to follow them. They could help you weigh the ingredients by looking at the numbers on the scales.</p>
