## Key Vocabulary

Philosophy - the study of some of the most basic questions about human life

Theology - the study of one or more religions

Human/Social Science - the study of society and the manner in which people behave and influence the world around us

Incarnation - the process by which a spiritual being takes form in a body

Sacrifice - a loss or something you give up, usually for the sake of a better cause

Proof - the evidence that shows something is true or valid

Compassion - we care about others, treat them with kindness, and feel a strong desire to help people in need

Denomination - a subgroup within a religion that operates under a common name, tradition, and identity

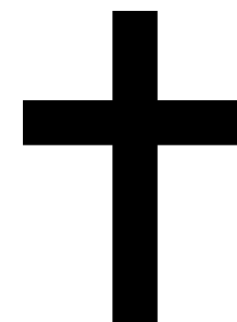
Christianity - the large group of religions who believe that the son of god was born a man - Jesus of Nazareth - over 2000 years ago

Place of Worship - a building where people gather to worship together e.g. church, synagogue, mosque

Faith - trusting in something or someone

Pray - sincere request to God or an object of worship (talking to God)

Belief - a feeling sure that someone or something exists or is true or trustworthy
