Key Vocabulary

Philosophy- the study of some of the most basic questions about human life

Theology- the study of one or more religions

Human/Social Science - the study of society and the manner in which people behave and influence the world around us

<u>Incarnation</u> - the process by which a spiritual being takes form in a body

<u>Sacrifice</u> - a loss or something you give up, usually for the sake of a better cause

<u>Proof</u> - the evidence that shows something is true or valid

<u>Compassion</u> - we care about others, treat them with kindness, and feel a strong desire to help people in need

Denomination - a subgroup within a religion that operates under a common name, tradition, and identity

<u>Christianity</u> - the large group of religions who believe that the son of god was born a man - Jesus of Nazareth - over 2000 years ago

Place of Worship - a building where people gather to worship together e.g. church, synagogue, mosque

Faith - trusting in something or someone

<u>Pray</u> - sincere request to God or an object of worship (talking to God)

Belief - a feeling sure that someone or something exists or is true or trustworthy
