**Roman Legion:** there were around 5000 soldiers in a Roman Army legion.

**Legionaries:** soldiers with Roman citizenship

**Auxiliaries:** soldiers (from other places) without Roman citizenship

**Cavalrymen:** soldiers on horseback

**Trading links:** a system where countries swap or exchange items or goods

**Taxes:** money paid by citizens to those in charge.


**Chronological:** events in the order which they happened in.

**Territory:** owned land

**Military centres:** places soldiers used to live and train.


**Settlement:** a place where people live

**Legacy:** a mark left on the world, putting a stamp on the future
