Roman Legion: there were around 5000 soldiers in a Roman Army legion.

Legionaries: soldiers with Roman citizenship

Auxiliaries: soldiers (from other places) without Roman citizenship

Cavalrymen: soldiers on horseback

Trading links: a system where countries swap or exchange items or goods

Taxes: money paid by citizens to those in charge.

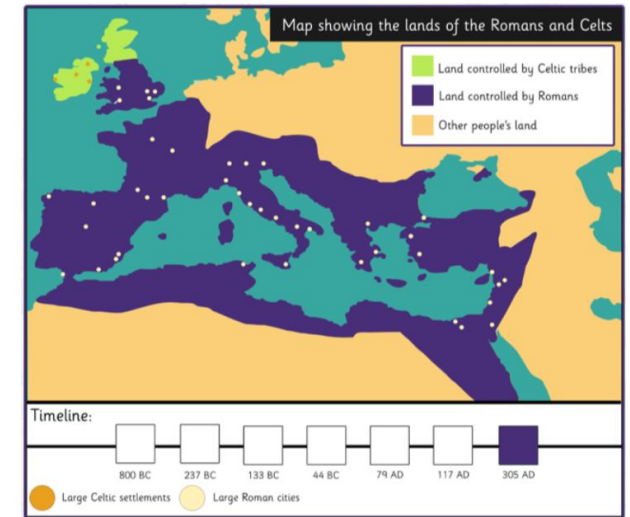
Chronological: events in the order which they happened in.

Territory: owned land

Military centres: places soldiers used to live and train.

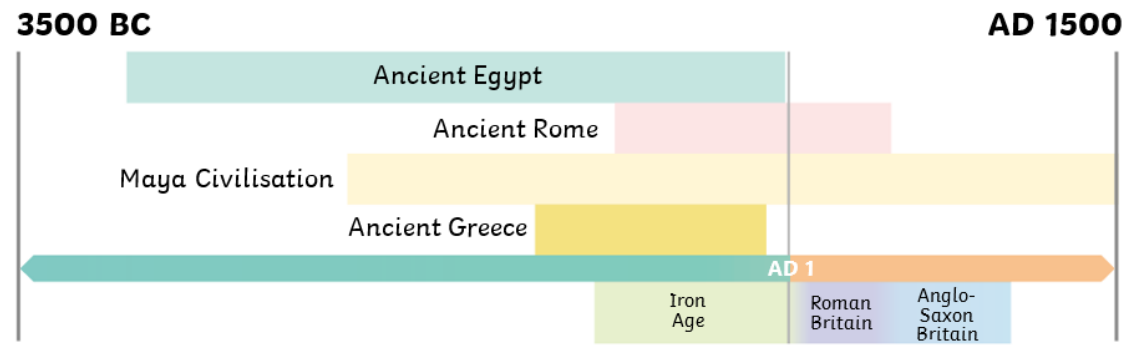
Settlement: a place where people live
