English

The children will be producing writing using a selection of materials from their whole class texts: letters, narratives and explanation texts. They will identify key features of the text and develop an understanding of its purpose.

Also, they will be reading 'The boy at the back of the class' discussing the details of the story. Using this text, the children will write a setting description, a detailed character description and an informal letter from a character's perspective.

Maths

During the Autumn Term, our focus will be on Number and Place Value; Addition, Subtraction, Multiplication & Division and Fractions. At the end of the term, we will also focus on Converting Units.

We will carry out two daily arithmetic sessions: Daily 10 and Fluent in Five. We will also develop multiplicative skills during daily fluency sessions.

You can support your child at home by ensuring they complete maths.co.uk homework which will be set on alternate weeks to Pobble Writing homework.

Science

This term's Science will focus on living things and their habitats. We will compare and contrast habitats of animals. We will identify how animals adapt to their environments.

We will also explore the school grounds and discover native wildlife.

History and Geography

We will be introducing the topic of Ancient Civilisations this term, where the children will explore Ancient Egypt. The children will develop their sense of chronology and time, whilst investigating the achievements of this civilisation and how they have impacted the world and modern-day life. The children will have a workshop in school on the 5th November to support this topic.

The children will be learning about physical impact within our world including: fires, droughts and pollution. The children will complete case studies on different parts of the world identifying how global warming is causing an impact to different people.

What can you do at home to help?

- Listen and encourage your child to read at home **three times a week**, record this in their reading record books.
- We will have a **weekly spelling test on a Friday**. Please ensure your child is practising the week's spellings. The overview can be seen as part of this newsletter.
- As this year is SATs year, it would be **beneficial** to support the children in learning their times tables and doing extra work at home. However, please do not use any past SATs papers as we use these in school!
