- Our exciting English topic begins by exploring the text 'Percy Jackson and the lightening thief' by Rick Riordan. Throughout the text, it explores the myths, monsters and legends of Ancient Greece in an adventurous and engagingly entertaining style.
- We will use Percy Jackson, as well as more traditional tales, to create pieces of writing including character descriptions, myths and playscripts.
- We will also further develop our recall, prediction, inference and summarising skills to aid us when reading.

#### Maths

- Year 5's journey into mathematics will begin by recapping our knowledge of place value which will enable us to develop our knowledge of numbers up to 1,000,000.
- We will then use our reasoning and problem-solving skills to explore the four operations, learn additional mathematical language and attempt to solve missing number equations and inverse problems.
- Additionally, we will deepen our knowledge of fractions, particularly regarding conversion, equivalence and mixed numbers.

## Key information

All around us, materials are used for a
differing and wide-ranging number of
purposes. Through our 'changing materials'
topic, pupils will learn more about different
materials and how they can be changed by
human intervention or by nature. The topic
aims to help pupils develop the following
enquiry skills: observation and measurement;
asking questions; evaluating and
communicating results.

Science

#### DT/Art

- In Art, we will be taking inspiration from African Batik and using a resist technique to create our own fabric artworks. Later, we will use knowledge of Ancient Greek art to aid us in sculpting pottery.
- In DT we will use acquired scientific understanding to help us create insulated products.

#### Humanities

- Through our Whats life like in the Alps? topic, we will explore grand questions such as 'Why are mountains so important to us?' and 'How were the world's greatest mountain ranges formed'. Before exploring the relevance of certain mountain ranges to our local area.
- Our Groovy Greeks topic gives us the opportunity to delve into another period of history and explore the Greek way of life between the 9<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> centuries. It also allows us to discover exciting topics such as the Titans and Gods of Ancient Greece. In addition to this, we will build our researching skills and reflect on the validity of our sources.

### What can you do at home to help?

- You could hear your child read and record this in their reading records. If pupils are able to read three times they will achieve their Roarsome Reader award. It is also beneficial to have short discussions with your children about what they are reading. Perhaps you could ask them about their favourite section or what they think may happen next!
- You will find termly spelling attached to this newsletter. Please allow pupils time to practice these regularly. Every pupil has a login to Times Table Rock Stars and the year group will be set regular competitions. Why not try the sound check area or challenge one of your teachers to beat your score?
- Regular homework will be sent weekly with Parents website. Pobble writing will be set weekly
- If possible, allow pupils to have notebooks/sketch books at home and encourage them to create artworks and stories that can be shared with the class.
