English

- This term we will be reading *The Green Ship* and *The Missing Bookshop*. We will be writing informal and formal letters and diaries. We will continue to embed the skills learned in the Autumn term and enhance our writing through a greater awareness of tense; past, present and future- conjunctions and sentence structure.
- We will also be looking at writing our own Winter poetry using our outdoor learning environment.

Maths

- We're excited to continue our weekly Maths for Life session. During the Spring term, we'll be focusing on Shape both 2D and 3D and Measures, including length, weight, mass, capacity and temperature.
- This term we will be extending our knowledge of multiplication and introduce the topic of division.
- We will then apply our understanding of division to the challenging topic of Fractions! Finding halves and quarters of shapes and amounts.
- We will also be consolidating our work on addition and subtraction through the topics of Money and Measures. See our class page for great resources to support your child at home.

DT/Art

- In **Art** children will be looking at the work of Giuseppe Arcimboldo and creating their own paintings and sculptures out of foods.
- In **DT**, children will research, design and create their own healthy wrap!

Humanities

- In **History**, we will be completing our local History study focussing on Oldbury comparing how things have changed including houses with a focus on a local inspirational person.
- In **Geography**, we will be learning about the world's wonders, recapping the names and locations of the world's oceans and considering what is unique about the local area.
