Curriculum Enrichment - swimming

Y4 started weekly swimming lessons on Tuesday. The course of lessons is an essential part of the PE curriculum and also the 'think safe, keep safe' aspect of our personal development curriculum. Over the term, children will develop their skills and confidence to swim independently and will learn water safety skills that will equip them for life. For a lot of children, school swimming lessons are their first swimming experience. With this in mind, I wanted to share how well everyone did on Tuesday. Because of the time of year, it might be a good idea to send children with a hat on Tuesdays so that heads are warm even when hair is a little damp. This is especially important for children in 4H and 4R who swim in the morning.

Curriculum Enrichment – music

Because we know how important music education is to children's academic, personal and social development, we buy into Doncaster Music Service's first access music programme. This enhances our music curriculum in year groups where teachers are not music specialists. Through this programme, children in LKS2 have a weekly music lesson taught by specialist music teachers. Mr Wragg teaches Ukulele in Y4 and Mr Watterson teaches Samba Band in Y3. We are hoping to get a Ukulele Orchestra up and running very soon – watch this space. (offered as an open after-school club)

Young Voices

Our Young Voices choir is now rehearsing on Wednesdays (until 4:15pm) in preparation for the concert at Sheffield Arena on 10th February. More news on the way over the next couple of weeks regarding the organisation of that event.

Y6 Crucial Crew

Another important 'think safe, keep safe' aspect of our personal development curriculum is the Y6 visit to Crucial Crew, coming up on the 4th February. It is delivered at the *Lifewise Centre in Rotherham* where there is a film-set environment featuring locations including a court room, supermarket and street scene. Pupils take part in a variety of interactive scenarios, covering topics from road safety and anti-social behaviour to child exploitation. The programme teaches pupils about safety and citizenship. At this stage in their life, many Y6 pupils are gaining a lot of independence without necessarily having the experience and skills to be able to keep themselves safe. This
