The children in Buttercups and Bluebells enjoyed playing with and sharing their toys.



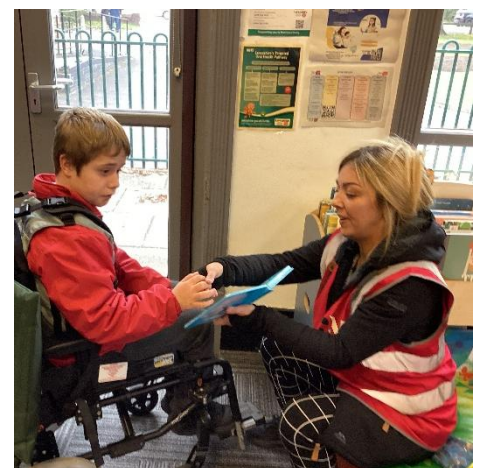
Tulip Class learnt about childhood parties. They made special party food and played party games with their friends.



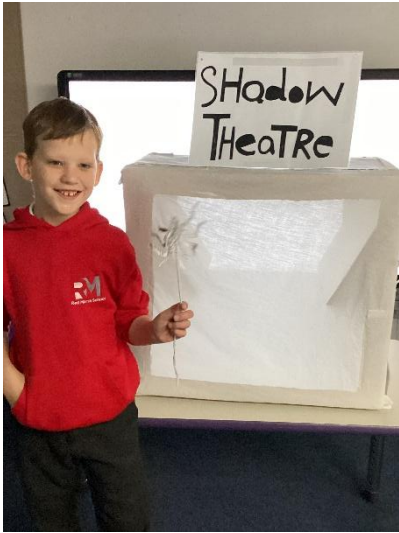
Rose Class spent time completing activities they may do with their families at home. They baked some treats and played games together.



Violet Class shared childhood stories. They visited Thornton Library.



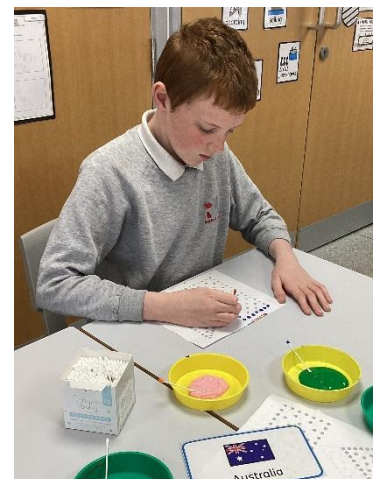
Blossom Class learnt about games and toys from around the world. They played the French game, Boules and created their own shadow puppets, like in Asia.
