2 Year Olds

We have been very busy this half term. We have enjoyed talking about fireworks and using paint to make marks that represent the colours we see in the sky.

We have also been exploring our big question, "How do we celebrate?" Together, we made cupcakes in the playdough and sang Happy Birthday to each other. We even created our own cakes, carefully measuring out ingredients and watching the changes that happened as we mixed everything together.

As the season has changed, we have been learning about the weather turning colder and noticing the leaves dropping from the trees. We have been practising our self-help skills by putting on our coats and wellies independently, getting ready for lots of outdoor learning.

We have loved engaging with our core text "Brown Bear, Brown Bear, What Do You See?" The children have explored colour mixing and observed the new colours they can create, linking beautifully to our core text.

We have also launched our toothbrushing programme this half term, and the children have taken part with great enthusiasm, learning how to look after their teeth and build healthy routines.

Finally, we have been enjoying the build-up to Christmas. We decorated our own Christmas tree and welcomed our loved ones in to join us for Christmas crafts and festive carols. It has been a wonderful way to end a busy half term together!



3-4 Year Olds

Our focus text this term has been Polar Bear, Polar Bear, What Do You Hear? by Bill Martin Jr. and Eric Carle. This wonderful story has helped the children explore the world of animals and the sounds they make. We have been learning lots of new animal names and practicing their sounds together, alongside playing listening games to develop concentration and language skills. The children have also had plenty of opportunities to count and reason during play. Whether it is counting blocks or sorting toys, these experiences build strong foundations for problem-solving. Their enthusiasm for building and construction has been fantastic to see. This interest has given us a great chance to explore shapes, patterns, and spatial awareness while encouraging creativity.

We have really enjoyed the opportunities that have involved you. The children love sharing their school day and experiences with you and it makes learning even more meaningful for them. Our trip to the Storybarn was a great success. Who could not enjoy and learn from an environment that offers books, dressing up, imagination, creativity, and a touch of magic alongside beautiful surroundings? It was a truly inspiring experience for the children and sparked so much joy and curiosity. The Christmas crafts were also a wonderful way of sharing our learning with you. The children produced some beautiful baubles for their Christmas trees—thank you for celebrating their creativity!

This term we launched our toothbrushing program, which is popular with the children. They enjoy the independence and love showing us their shiny, healthy teeth after brushing! We have also started a phonics program called Little Wandle, which includes tuning into sounds and rhymes. This will give the children a great start to their Reception year when they leave us in July.

The visit from the librarians was, as always, well received by both children and parents. Visiting the library, both ours and the local one, and sharing books adds another wonderful dimension to your child's learning journey

As Christmas approaches, the children have been singing their little hearts out as they learn the songs for our festive singalong. We enjoyed sharing this with the residents of Barklafields and with you during our Christmas singalong.

Green (97%+) is good attendance




Amber (91-96%) is a cause for concern
