2 Year Olds

This half-term we have been very busy. We have welcomed new children into the setting and have helped them to settle in and familiarise themselves with our nursery routines. The children have been building in confidence, forming relationships with their peers and becoming familiar with their daily routines, which has been lovely to see. We also experienced a big change in the weather, with snow and ice arriving. The children had the opportunity to explore this first-hand by investigating fresh snow and watching as it turned to ice. They enjoyed discovering how it felt and discussing what we could make using the snow and ice, supporting their curiosity and sensory exploration. We have really enjoyed learning about our topic **'People Who Help Us'**. We have explored this in a variety of ways, including being doctors in the role play area. Outdoors, the children worked together to create their own emergency vehicles using a range of crates and loose parts, building large-scale vehicles and developing their imagination and teamwork skills. We also had a very exciting surprise when the local fire service visited to talk to us about their important job. The children were thrilled to explore the fire engine, see the flashing lights and hear the loud siren. Finally, we have been focusing on our core book, **The Gingerbread Man**. The children loved bringing the story to life, using puppets and animals, and they enjoyed joining in with the repeated refrain, *Run, run, as fast as you can, you can't catch me, I'm the Gingerbread Man!*



3-4 Year Olds

We began the half term by talking about what the children had done over Christmas. They were all excited to talk about their presents. They have also been practising their cutting skills by looking through toy catalogues, choosing the ones they like and gluing them onto paper, getting ready for next Christmas!

The topic for the half term has been about people who helps us, and the children have been dressing up to carry out the many jobs these people do. It has also enabled them to extend their vocabulary such as 'stethoscope', 'bandage' and 'emergency'. We have been very lucky to have been visited by the local Fire Brigade who talked about the role in helping us and allowed us to explore their uniforms and equipment. The sirens were so loud—we had to put our hands over our ears! We have also been working on repeated refrains in books that the children love **The Runaway Chapati** and **The Gingerbread Man** have reinforced 'run, run as fast as you can'. We have also done lots of counting whilst the children play to show how important it is in everything we do. Well done children!

We hope that you have enjoyed sharing their learning at home by using the Knowledge Organiser, alongside the rhymes and Makaton we share on School Spider. Thank you all for supporting your children and have a happy half-term holiday!
