Dear Parents/Guardians,

Welcome to Year 3! We hope you had a lovely summer break and are ready for the new school year. We are looking forward to our year together, learning lots of exciting things and having fun along the way. We would like to take this opportunity to inform you of the different things we will be doing during our first term, as well as a few other general notices.

Miss Tandy will be teach the class on a Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday and Mrs Delaney-McGaw will teach on a Thursday and Friday. Mrs Hosker will teach first thing Wednesday morning. Our in class support this year is Miss Pimm. PE takes place on a Monday and Thursday.

Homework (Maths and Spelling) will be set on Google Classroom on Friday and due in the following Wednesday. Homework should be completed by children independently wherever possible. We will show the children how to use Google classroom and send logins home. Over the next week, children will bring home a reading book that they should be able to read independently with 95% accuracy. As we are now in KS2, children are responsible for changing and choosing their own books. They may bring their book to school when they are ready to change; we will give the children opportunities to change their book every day.

Please ensure that children have a bottle of water they can keep in the classroom and all belongings are clearly labelled with their name.

This term the children will take part in outdoor learning every Friday. More details about this will be shared soon. Below is what we will be learning this half term:

History	History- Early life in Britain- children will learn what life was like during The Stone Age, Iron Age and Bronze Age in Britain with a focus on the importance of historical landmarks and artefacts and what they can teach us.
Science	Rocks- types of rocks, how rocks are formed, properties of rocks, fossils, soil formation, Scientific enquiry- children learn skills they will use throughout their scientific learning
English	Story writing- 'Stone Age Boy' Instructional writing- 'Stone Age Boy'
Maths	Place Value- represent, compare and order numbers to 1000 Addition and Subtraction- use number bonds, add/subtract 1s/10s/100s, add and subtract across 100
PE	Outdoor learning and Gymnastics
RE	Hinduism- How do Hindus view God? How is Diwali celebrated and how do Hindus worship?
Computing	Digital portraits- children know how to create a digital image using a range of tools, pens, brushes and effects.
PSHE	Relationships- How can I be a good team member? This unit is inspired by the idea that if a class team works well together, it has a positive impact on all of its members and what they can achieve.

French	Getting to know you
Art	Drawing skills inspired by the Stone Age
