Dear Parents/Guardians,

Welcome to Year 3! We hope you had a lovely summer break and are ready for the new school year. We are looking forward to our year together, learning lots of exciting things and having fun along the way. We would like to take this opportunity to inform you of the different things we will be doing during our first term, as well as a few other general notices.

Miss Tandy will teach the class on a Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday and Mrs Delaney-McGaw will teach on a Thursday and Friday. Mrs Hosker will teach first thing on a Wednesday morning. Our in class support this year is Miss Pimm.

PE takes place on a Tuesday and Thursday.

Over the next week, children will bring home a reading book that they should be able to read confidently. Assessed reading books are designed to be read independently and should be read with 95% accuracy. As we are now in the Juniors, children are responsible for choosing and changing their own books and will have the opportunity to change them each day when they are ready. Please record any reading at home on Boom Reader and let us know if you need your login details. Children should read independently or with an adult as often as possible. Reading together is a wonderful way to build confidence, develop vocabulary and encourage a love of reading. Maths homework will be set every Friday and should be completed by the following Wednesday. MyMaths login details will be sent home over the next week.

Please ensure that children have a bottle of water they can keep in the classroom and all belongings are clearly labelled with their name (including PE kits).

Below is what we will be learning this term, through until Christmas:

History or Geography	History- Early life in Britain- children will learn what life was like during The Stone Age, Iron Age and Bronze Age in Britain with a focus on the importance of historical landmarks and artefacts and what they can teach us.
Science	Rocks- types of rocks, how rocks are formed, properties of rocks, fossils, soil formation, Scientific enquiry- children learn skills they will use throughout their scientific learning
English	Story writing- 'Stone Age Boy' Instructional writing- 'Stone Age Boy'
Maths	Place Value- represent, compare and order numbers to 1000 Addition and Subtraction- use number bonds, add/subtract 1s/10s/100s, add and subtract across 100
PE	Tag Rugby and Gymnastics
RE	Hinduism- how do Hindus view God, how is Diwali celebrated and how do Hindus worship
Computing	Digital portraits- children know how to create a digital image using a range of tools, pens, brushes and effects.
PSHE	Relationships- How can I be a good team member? This unit is inspired by the idea that if a class team works well together, it has a positive impact on all of its members and what they can achieve.
Music	Glockenspiel
French	Getting to know you
Art	Drawing inspired by the Stone Age
