Reading

Reading Records are to be used to keep a log of every time your child reads at home. These will be checked and reviewed each week (on a Friday) with the expectation that your child will have read five times.

Regular reading is one of the most effective ways to support your child's learning. It not only develops fluency, vocabulary, and comprehension skills, but also helps build a lifelong love of books. To encourage this positive habit, children who consistently record at least five reading sessions per week will be recognised and rewarded, therefore kindly ask for your support in ensuring your child's Reading Record is filled in accurately and signed.

Snack & Packed Lunches

The junior children unfortunately do not receive a snack, but your child can bring in a piece of fruit to eat at morning playtime if they would like to.

Please be reminded that our school operates as a nut-free environment. As such, we kindly request that families do not send their children to school with any nuts or snacks containing nuts. Your cooperation in maintaining a safe and healthy environment for all pupils is greatly appreciated.
