- A spelling activity will also be set on spelling frame, an online resource. This is just one strategy to learn weekly spellings.

READING



- Children are to bring their reading books to school every day.
- If a reading book needs to be changed, please write in the reading record book that your child has finished their book / read to the end.
- The children are encouraged to read <u>every day</u>, where possible. Please ask questions about the thoughts and feelings of characters, as well as the plot.

If a child is feeling dysregulated and needs time to reflect on their behaviour choices, Mrs. Crosby or Mrs. Mearns will have a quiet word with the child. If this continues, they are asked to have a chat away from the carpet area. This will give the child the opportunity to 'reset' and start again. Should the behaviour continue, a reflection guide will be given and parents will be contacted at the end of the day. A behaviour plan will be drawn up to help the child with making the right choices in class.
