HOMework



- New spellings will be set each Friday on the class blog.
- The focus will be on reading, spelling and times tables (2,5 and 10).
- A weekly spelling quiz will be given each Thursday. The times tables quizzes will begin in Autumn Term 2.
- A spelling activity will also be set on spelling frame, an online resource. This is just one strategy to learn weekly spellings.



READING

- Children are to bring their reading books to school **every day.**
- If a reading book needs to be changed, please write in the reading record book that your child has finished their book / read to the end.
- The children are encouraged to read every day, where possible. Please ask questions about the thoughts and feelings of characters, as well as the plot.





WATER BOTTLES, SNACKS AND BOOK BAGS

- Water bottles are to be of a standard size containing water (not juice).
- Snacks- healthy snacks are to be placed in trays in the mornings. **NO NUTS** or products containing nuts, please (we are a nut-free school).
- Book bags- **no rucksacks, if possible**. They are difficult to store in classrooms.

BEHAVIOUR POLICY

Our Behaviour Board outlines our expectations of behaviour. It contains school and class rules, as well as the zones of regulation.



If a child is feeling dysregulated and needs time to reflect on their behaviour choices, Mrs. Price or Mrs. Lago will have a quiet word with the child. If this continues, the child is asked to have a chat away from the carpet area. This will give the child the opportunity to 'reset' and start again. Should the behaviour continue, a reflection guide will be given and parents will be contacted at the end of the day. A behaviour plan will be drawn up to help the child with making the right choices in class.
