Remote Learning Plan



'In our Christian family we all SHINE in the light of Jesus'

In the event of a child or group of children needing to be educated at home, the school has a plan to ensure the curriculum continues to be delivered to these children in the most appropriate way.

Aims

- Ensure consistency in the approach to remote learning for pupils who aren't in school
- Set out expectations for all members of the school community with regards to remote learning
- Provide appropriate guidelines for data protection

This plan will be applied in the following instances:

- Euxton CE Primary School is shut in compliance with advice of Public Health.
- The event that school is unexpectedly closed for any reason
- A child cannot attend school for a valid reason

We will consider providing remote education to pupils in circumstances when in-person attendance is either not possible or contrary to government guidance.

This might include:

- Occasions when we decide that opening our school is either:
 - Not possible to do safely
 - Contradictory to guidance from local or central government
- Occasions when individual pupils, for a limited duration, are unable to physically attend school but are able to continue learning, for example because:
- They have an infectious illness
- They are preparing for or recovering from some types of operation
- They are recovering from injury and attendance in school may inhibit such recovery

- Their attendance has been affected by a special educational need or disability (SEND) or a mental health issue.

Our remote curriculum

Our aim as a school is to ensure all pupils learning remotely have access to the same quality of education as those in school. Therefore, we will teach the same curriculum as we do in school. However, we might need to make some adaptations in some subjects in order to make learning accessible to those at home.

For example: In subjects that require a significant number of resources such as the practical aspects of Science, Music, Art, Design and Technology, the teacher might either post a video made by specialist teachers from Oak Academy (see link to their lessons below)

Whole School Closure

Microsoft Teams or Zoom would be used as an online teaching and learning tool. All pupils would be sent school login details and must access remote learning using these details only. Teachers will either hold daily live lessons or direct children to pre-record videos of core subjects such as Maths and English.

Pupils who do not have digital or online access at home

We recognise that some pupils may not have suitable online access at home. We take the following approaches to support those pupils to access remote education:

- If your child does not have access to a device please contact the school office and we will be able to loan you an iPad.
- If your child does not have internet access at home, please contact the school office as the school can support with this as well.
- If you would prefer to collect printed work packs, please contact the school office to make arrangement for this.

Support for children with special educational needs and disabilities

Teachers will work closely with the school SENCO and the ELSAs to provide personalised and 1:1 support for children with additional needs.

This will include:

- Regular phone calls

- Personalised tasks and resources

Engagement and feedback

- All pupils, who are fit and well, are expected to engage with remote learning daily.
- Parents are required to support their child adapt to routines by following the daily timetable set by their teacher.
- Teachers and teaching assistants will feedback to children and support them with any work they struggled to complete.
- If teachers are concerned about any child, they will contact their parents to give adequate support or advice.

Contact with pupils/parents

Parents are able to contact the school via telephone or email (bursar@euxton.lancs.sch.uk) whilst your child is accessing remote learning, should support be required.

Providing feedback

Pupils can send any completed work to teachers via the office. Work that children complete on paper should be kept safe and returned to school when possible.

Safeguarding

Staff will monitor that pupils are accessing work daily and attending online teaching sessions to account for pupils. Where staff cannot account for pupils, they will make

contact with families. Where contact cannot be made, staff will refer the matter to a Designated Safeguarding Lead for further action.

Sharing personal data

Staff members are unlikely to need to collect and/or share personal data. However, if it does become necessary, staff are reminded to collect and/or share as little personal data as possible online. All data collection will be compliant with GDPR guidelines.

Monitoring arrangements

This policy will be reviewed by the SLT on an annual basis.
