Children will explore the question:

Why is the Civil Rights Movement still important today?

Children will learn about key notable figures in the history of civil rights and human rights and about how their contribution made an impact. From here, they will draw parallels with the Civil Rights Movement in Britain, specifically focusing on The Bristol Bus Boycott before exploring how the movement was impacted by the Windrush Generation.

Maths
