What is Early Help?

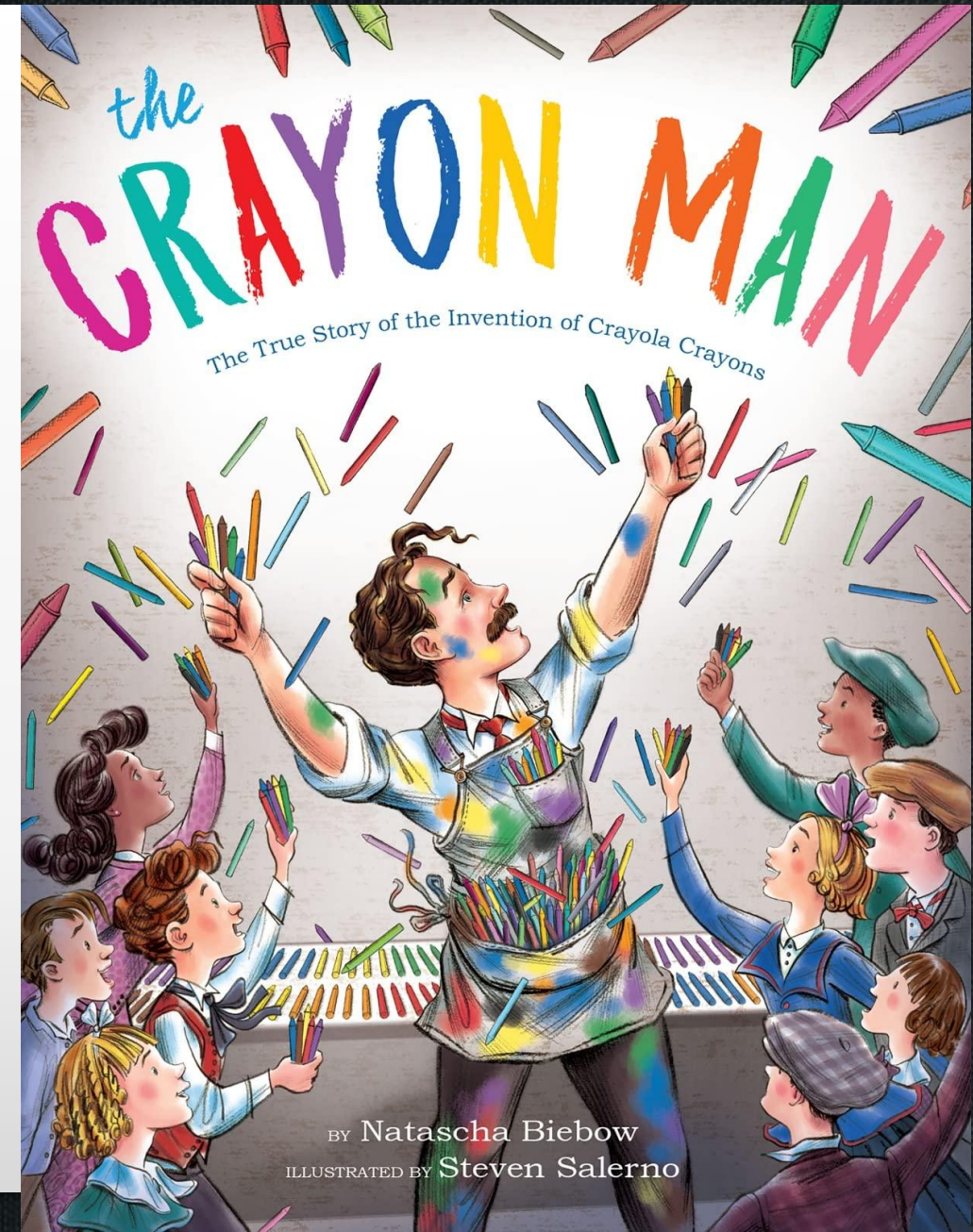

There are many reasons why a family may require Early Help support. As a school, we are here to support and help. We are not here to judge or tell you what to do.

Early help means taking action to support a child and/or their family as soon as a problem emerges.

Curriculum

- Strong, bespoke approach to teaching the National curriculum – strong, meaningful links across the curriculum where these can be made, use of visits, outdoor learning, visitors and experts
- Mathematics and English taught daily discretely and interwoven across curriculum
- Teaching children how to become more independent, successful learners, nurturing a growth mindset in all our children
- Give children ownership of their learning – many opportunities for challenge, independence
- All children access some small group work or individual work across the year
- Use assessment as a tool to see where children are, to find out what their gaps and next steps are and to inform future learning

Knowledge Organiser



- Knowledge Organisers will be sent out periodically through the year
- These set out the minimum knowledge and vocabulary children must learn within our theme for the half-term
- This knowledge will be enhanced by much greater learning in class and many rich learning experiences
- Please help your children learn the facts and vocabulary – make it fun!
- Knowledge Organisers will be added to the class page of the website so we can keep remembering and recalling learning from earlier in the year.

Technology

- Salesbury embraces the safe and positive use of technology!
- We are part of Smartphone free childhood.
- We actively teach online safety
- We do use technology to support learning – smaller chunks as part of learning within lessons and recognise its amazing value. Still lots of reading, writing, recording and active learning!
- We have active subscriptions to software that supports learning e.g. TTRS, Numbots, IDL, Spelling Programmes – usernames and passwords will be sent to you
- All our technology in school is highly filtered. We receive daily reports which tell us what children are accessing and who they are, even if they use their Chromebooks at home

Ongoing Assessments

- Progress is tracked for every individual child on a termly basis in mathematics, reading and writing. This helps us to monitor progress throughout the year and adapt teaching and support where needed.
- Most children are taught within the year group expectations for the year group, children will be assessed at three different points in the school year against the following criteria: entering, developing, secure in meeting year group expectations. Children are not expected to be secure in the year group expectations until the end of year but are expected to make progress within the expectations throughout the year.
- Children who are not ready for year group expectations will be supported to make progress towards these, children who demonstrate a strong secure understanding of expectations will be challenged through problem solving, deepening understanding, applying knowledge learned and creative learning opportunities
- Support programmes are used to support small groups of children throughout the school as and when needed
- You will be given a termly report including a summary of their learning attitudes and assessments prior to Parents Evening, these help you prepare for Parents Evening and formulate any questions you do have





Reading

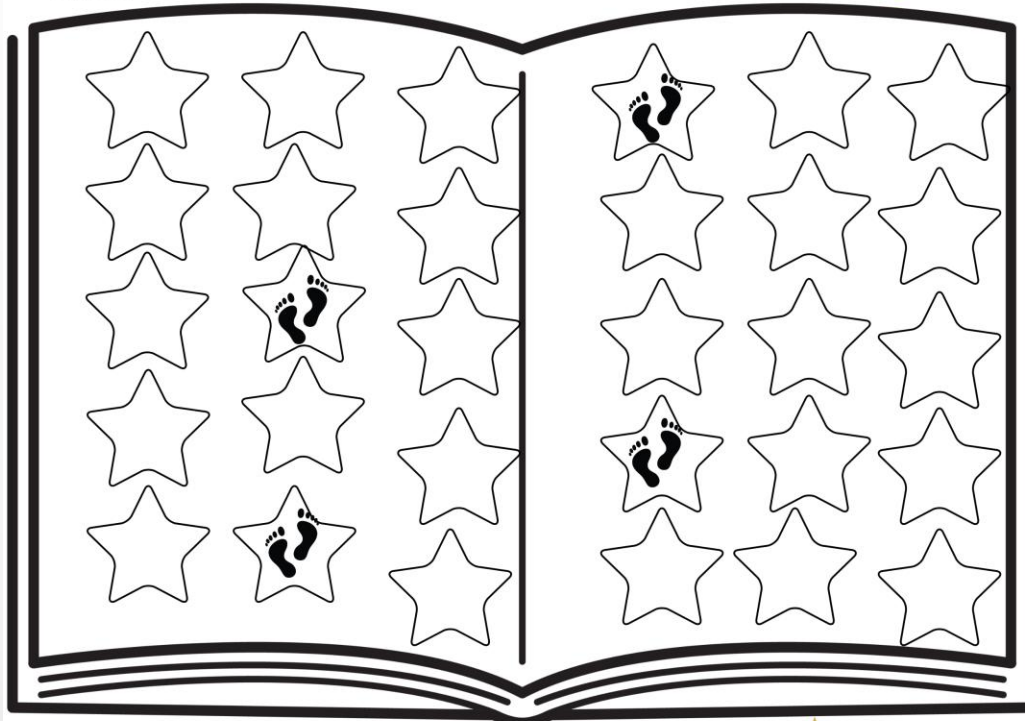
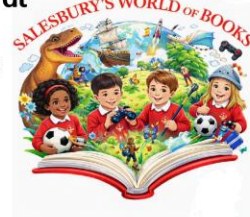
- Whole Class Reading taught each day

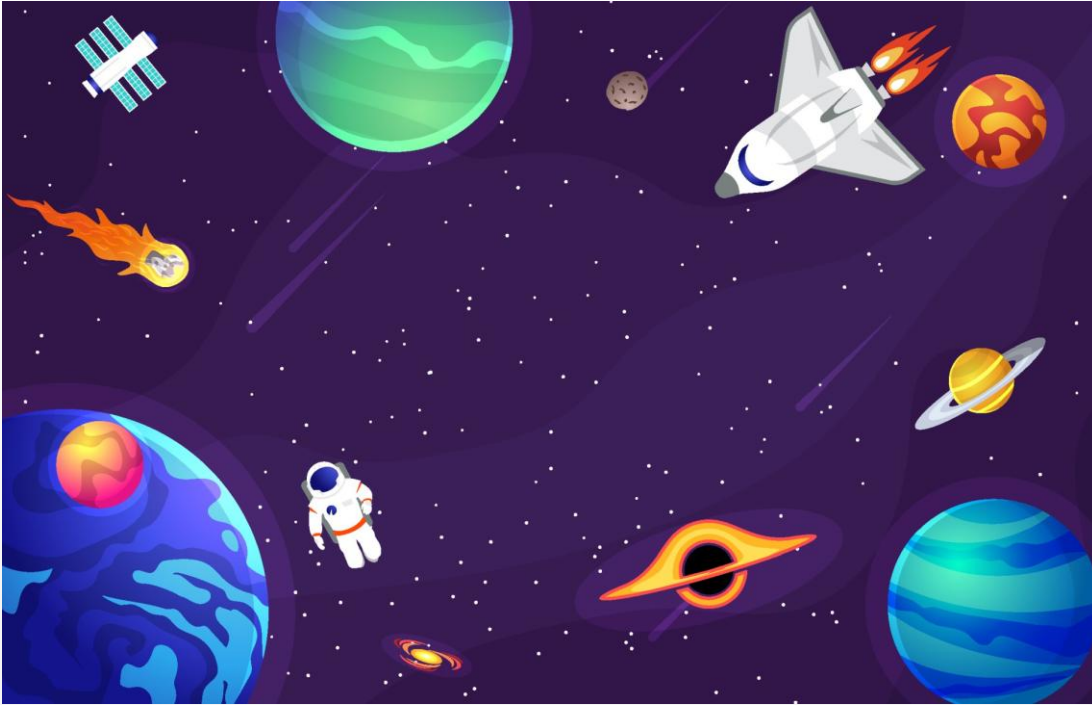

Reading Gameboard

Research shows regular home reading, especially reading aloud, really does make a difference.

Gameboard to encourage regular reading. Please initial each day your child reads at home, when they reach a footprint, it is your turn to read to them. We will have a visual in class to see how children are progressing. This is something all children can do – practice!

Mission in Maths



“You can identify a fluent learner when they have a secure understanding of what they’re doing and why they’re doing it”. Gill Knight

Building mathematical fluency is crucial for children’s overall understanding of Maths.

Children will be given a **Mission in Maths Gameboard** to encourage regular focus on key Maths facts.

Certificates will be awarded for completion of the ‘missions’.

Year 4 Multiplication Tables Check (MTC)

- By the end of Year 4, the children are expected to learn their times tables up to 12.
- In Summer Term the children in Year 4 will sit the Government MTC test.
- This is completed electronically.
- The test consists of 25 questions, with a timer of 6 seconds to answer each question.
- Results are published and shared with parents in the end of term, Summer Term Reports.



Homework

- In year 4 and 5 there will be a homework grid for each half term with different activities on that the children can complete.
- Sent home electronically, on the school website and the children will be given a copy to take home.
- If needed, an extra task will be given which will most likely focus on Mathematics or English (for example, extra comprehensions etc.)
- There will be a weekly spelling sheet that will be given out on a Monday and needs to be handed in by the Friday.





Behaviour

- High expectations of behaviour
- Recognition Board
- Individual incidents dealt with separately
- Choice Card System
- Encourage children to reflect on their behaviour, take ownership and plan for their own improvements
- High 5 is our celebration of good behaviour shown during the week
- Consequences may include loss of privileges
- Mission in Action tickets given for 'above and beyond,' winners go and have Hot Chocolate
- House Points
- Importance of school and home working together – please raise any concerns directly, where possible



P.E.

- P.E. is on Tuesday and Thursday
- Children may wear the school tracksuit on these days or come in uniform and change for the lesson. We ask that children do not wear their own leggings, sports tops etc
- All children must participate in PE as part of the curriculum. We cover a range of sports and physical activities which keep children active and engaged. There will really be something for everyone!
- Earrings or other jewellery cannot be worn
- Active learning built into other days e.g. Five to thrive, curriculum activities, active learning strategies

Health and Safety



- Please ensure long hair is tied back at all times. Please keep hair accessories simple school colours
- Simple stud earring can be worn in Key Stage 2 but should not be worn at all on PE days. Earrings cannot be worn in EYFS or KS2
- Only prescribed medicine to be administered in school, a signed form must be completed which is available from the school office. As medicine is administered, this will be entered on Medical Tracker. Most medicine is kept in the school office except emergency medication.
- Given statutory changes, all staff have received additional training in allergies and anaphylaxis. We have emergency epipens in school which are sited alongside our defibrillators
- All our support staff are first aid trained, all staff working in nursery and reception have paediatric first aid training.
- If your child has a care/health plan, please ensure we have an accurate and updated copy in school. This will probably be co-ordinated with your health professionals. Please see Mr Connell or Mrs Elvy if you have any questions
- Please attend to head-lice immediately and before returning to school to limit the spread!
- Online Safety – please follow age-appropriate guidelines at all times – safeguarding!
- We do practice fire drills, evacuation and lockdown procedures – these will be practiced very quickly in the next couple of weeks. We do pre-warn children for the first drill.
- Please update us if somebody different is collecting your child from school



Drinks & Snacks

- Children are encouraged to have a bottle of water in school each day and take regular sips to keep hydrated. We do encourage children to have the school water bottle or to keep the bottles to a reasonable size – this is neat and fits well on the school desks
- Milk can be purchased for all children from the term they are five via CoolMilk, up to this point it is provided free of charge. Please see school office for further information.
- Key Stage 2 children may bring in a healthy snack – no biscuits, crisps or chocolate. Fruit or vegetables are ideal.
- All snacks will be eaten under supervision.



School Uniform

- High standards throughout the year
- Children need a coat as we go outside throughout the year
- Please keep hair accessories very simple and in school colours or black/white (no decorative accessories)
- Black school shoes. Trainers can be worn on PE days only
- Name labels - please label absolutely everything and keep topping up during the year

Attendance

- Regular attendance and punctuality matters! Salesbury has strong attendance so we thank you for your support with this!
- We open the doors at 8.45 and the register is taken at 8.55am so children need to be in their classroom at this time
- Learning starts straight away – we have a very full timetable
- Obviously, if children are poorly they cannot attend and we understand this but do encourage children to get in good habits
- Please telephone the school office as early as possible if children are not attending and use the absence line. To ensure safety, the school office will contact emergency contacts if we do not receive a message
- Children who have had vomiting or diarrhoea must stay off school for 24 hours to limit the opportunity to spread this
- We are not allowed to authorise holidays during term-time unless there are particularly exceptional circumstances. Please remember penalty notices are now in place
