Reading – daily task

Aim for at least 5 minutes per day – don't forget to put this in your reading diary and have your Game Board signed. Try to read aloud- this will improve fluency and understanding.

Use Spelling Shed to practise the spellings and their pattern, in the form of a game.

Complete the weekly sheet sent home on a Friday.

Key words taught every week in Phonics will be on your child's class page on the school website.



Maths - weekly task

- Mission in Maths Grid focus on the tasks:
 - 1) To know all number bonds to 10. Use games on the website, 'Topmarks' to help.
 - 2) To know odd and even numbers to 20. (Use games on the website, 'Topmarks')
 - 3) To count up and back in 2s to 24. Please prioritise this with your child.



Creative Task - Material Hunt – gather and group a variety of objects made from the following materials:

wood/metal/plastic/glass/paper/cardboard

Verbally tell an adult why each object is made from that material. For example, a box is made from cardboard because it is strong and lightweight.

Take a photo and send it to your class teacher.
