## Reading – daily task

Aim for at least 5 minutes per day – don't forget to put this in your reading diary and have your **Game Board signed**. Try to read aloud- this will improve fluency and understanding.

## Spellings & Key words – weekly task

Use Spelling Shed to practise the spellings and their pattern, in the form of a game.

Complete the weekly sheet sent home on a Friday, (paper copy).

Key words taught every week in Phonics will be on your child's class page on the school website.



## Maths - weekly task

- Mission in Maths Grid – focus on the tasks:

**To confidently count up and back in 2s to 24, in 5s to 60 and in 10s to 120.**

(If your child can confidently recall these facts, start to learn them as table facts).

**To recall all double and halves facts to 10, fluently and confidently.**

***Please prioritise this with your child.***



**Creative Task - Healthy snack** – Help to make a healthy snack at home. Take a photograph/draw a picture of your creation and add this to your homework folder.

Challenge- Write a set of instructions of how you made your snack.

- Can you read our vocabulary?
- Can you use our vocabulary in a spoken sentence?
