Key knowledge to learn

- 1** A shelter is a safe place or building that keeps humans and animals protected.
- 2** Stone-Age houses changed from caves to permanent structures.
- 3** Tudor houses have thatched roofs and a wooden frame, often painted black and white.
- 4** The Great Fire of London happened in 1666.
- 5** Victorian houses are made from strong red brick, slate roofs and sash windows.
- 6** Houses today can be detached, semi-detached, terraced, cottage, flat, bungalow.
