ENGLISH

In English, we will be looking at our 'No Outsiders' book 'The Odd Egg' by Emily Gravett, where we'll be discussing feelings and taking pride in ourselves.

We will then be moving onto 'The Tear Thief' by Carol Ann Duffy.

MATHS

In Maths, we will be tackling our Fractions unit, before moving onto time, statistics and position.

During this term we will be continuing to work on our arithmetic and problem solving skills.

SCIENCE

In Science, we will be starting our new topic, all about Plants. We will be recapping the parts of a plant, and the plants commonly found in Britain.

We will be discovering how plants grow from seeds to mature plants, and what they need in order to do this successfully

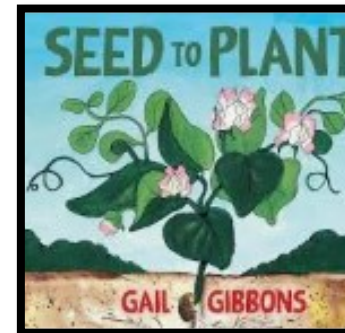
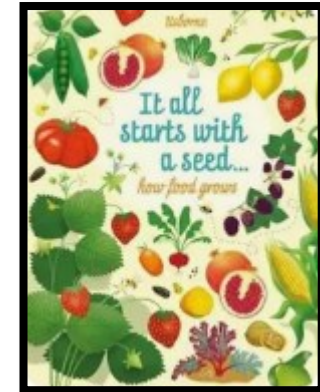
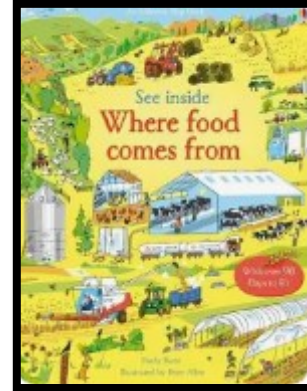
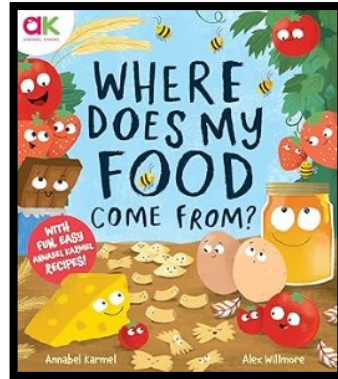
Homework will be sent out on a Friday, to be returned the following Tuesday. Please give your child some time to complete the activities independently.

Please continue to practise cursive handwriting with your child. Your child can practise their times tables on Times Table Rockstars.

Phonics/Spelling

The children will take part in daily phonics sessions which run from 9am-9.30am. Phonics groups are streamed based on your child's phonic knowledge, their ability to segment and blend and their tricky word recognition. All staff who lead phonics groups have been fully trained in the delivery of our phonics scheme 'Supersonic Phonic Friends'. The children will receive weekly spellings which link directly to the sounds they have been working on in phonics during the week. Spellings will be given out each Friday. The spelling sheet that the children bring home does not need to be returned to school, it is just for them to practise with you at home. Although the children will be tested on their spellings, scores are not recorded and shared, all efforts are celebrated and rewarded.
