How do we know some people feel a special connection to a god?

Exploring how we know that some people are believed to have a special connection to God through looking for clues in religious stories.

PE

Geography

Mexico

Children will explore the world using atlases and globes, identifying the seven continents, five oceans, the countries, capital cities, and surrounding seas of the United Kingdom. They will develop fieldwork skills by creating simple maps and describing key local features. Children will also study the human and physical geography of Tulum, Mexico, and compare it with their local area.
