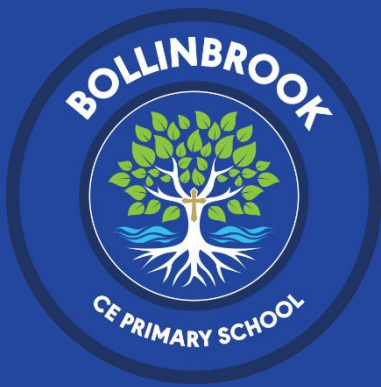

Uniform expectations

Mission Statement

... 'a tree firmly planted by streams of water which yields its fruit...' Psalm 1v3

At Bollinbrook CE Primary the Christian value of 'Love' is at the heart of who we are as a community. We teach our children to be rooted in Jesus Christ so they develop a love of learning that supports their academic, emotional and spiritual growth. If rooted in Christ, children can grow into who they were created to be. Based on Psalm 1v3, 'like a tree firmly planted by streams of water which yields its fruit...' We are helping our children grow spiritually, emotionally and academically laying firm roots that will provide strong foundations and bear fruit that will help them on the next stage of their educational journey.

Rationale

The Department for Education (DfE) [Cost of uniforms](#) means schools in England must ensure that school uniform costs are reasonable, and parents get the best value for money.

This policy aims to:

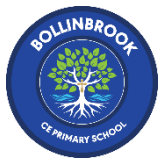
- Set out our approach to requiring a uniform that is of reasonable cost, mini
- mum branding and offers the best value for money for parents and carers
- Explain how we will avoid discrimination in line with our legal duties under the Equality Act 2010
- Clarify our expectations for school uniform

Our school's legal duties under the Equality Act 2010

The [Equality Act 2010](#) prohibits discrimination against an individual based on the protected characteristics, which include sex, race, religion or belief, and gender reassignment.

To avoid discrimination, our school will:

- Avoid listing uniform items based on sex, to give all pupils the opportunity to wear the uniform they feel most comfortable in or that most reflects their self-identified gender
- Make sure that our uniform costs the same for all pupils
- Allow all pupils to have long hair (though we reserve the right to ask for this to be tied back)
- Allow all pupils to style their hair in the way that is appropriate for school yet makes them feel most comfortable
- Allow pupils to request changes to swimwear for religious reasons
- Allow pupils to wear headscarves and other religious symbols



- Allow for adaptations to our policy on the grounds of equality by asking pupils or their parents to get in touch with the headteacher, head@bollinbrook.cheshire.sch.uk who can answer questions about the policy and respond to any requests

Limiting the cost of school uniform

Our school has a duty to make sure that the uniform we require is affordable, in line with statutory [guidance](#) from the Department for Education on the cost of school uniform.

We understand that items with distinctive characteristics (such as branded items, or items that have to have a school logo or a unique fabric / colour / design) cannot be purchased from a wide range of retailers and that requiring many such items limits parents' ability to 'shop around' for a low price.

We will make sure our uniform:

- is available at a reasonable cost
- provides the best value for money for parents/carers
- reduces branded items

We will do this by:

- carefully considering whether any items with distinctive characteristics are necessary
- making the wearing of items with the school logo on non-compulsory
- allowing the wearing of cheaper alternatives to school-branded items
- avoiding specific requirements for items pupils could wear on non-school days, such as coats, bags and shoes
- keeping the number of optional branded items to a minimum, so that the school's uniform can act as a social leveler
- no difference in uniform requirements for different years
- avoiding different uniform requirements for extra-curricular activities
- providing clothing for inter-school competitions
- making sure that arrangements are in place for parents to acquire second-hand uniform items
- avoiding frequent changes to uniform specifications and minimising the financial impact on parents of any changes
- consulting with parents and pupils on any proposed significant changes to the uniform policy and carefully considering any complaints about the policy

Expectations for school uniform

We expect all pupils to attend school in the correct school uniform. Full details can be found on the school website.

Our uniform has been designed to be practical, comfortable and cost-effective. No child is required to wear branded items, although logoed sweatshirts and cardigans are available at a low cost.



School Uniform

- White polo shirt (logo optional)
- Grey skirt, pinafore, trousers or shorts
- Royal blue sweatshirt or cardigan (logo optional)
- White or grey socks/tights
- Black school shoes

PE Kit

- Royal blue T-shirt
- Plain navy or black shorts. Shorts should be of an appropriate length and suitable for active participation in a primary school setting.
- Plain navy or black tracksuit bottoms, joggers or fleece for colder weather.

Children should attend school in their PE kit on their allocated PE day.

Swimming Kit

- Swimming costume or trunks
- Swimming cap for pupils with long hair
- Towel

Where to purchase it

- Any local supermarket for non-branded items
- Classworx in Macclesfield if you wish to buy the branded jumper/cardigan
- Information about second-hand uniform, for example:
 - Second-hand uniform sale – available from main entrance

Expectations for our school community

Pupils are expected to wear the correct uniform at all times (other than specified non-school uniform days) while:

- on the school premises
- travelling to and from school
- at out-of-school events or on trips that are organised by the school, or where they are representing the school (if required)

Pupils are also expected to contact the Headteacher, Miss Le Marinel if they want to request an amendment to the uniform policy in relation to their protected characteristics.



Parents and carers

Parents and carers are expected to make sure their child has the correct uniform and PE kit, and that every item is:

- clean
- clearly labelled with the child's name
- in good condition

Parents are also expected to contact Miss Le Marinel if they want to request an amendment to the uniform policy in relation to:

- their child's protected characteristics
- the cost of the uniform

Parents are expected to lodge any complaints or objections relating to the school uniform in a timely and reasonable manner. Disputes about the cost of the school uniform will be:

- resolved locally
- dealt with in accordance with our school's complaints policy

The school will work closely with parents to arrive at a mutually acceptable outcome

Staff

Staff will closely monitor pupils to make sure they are in correct uniform. They will give any pupils and families breaching the uniform policy the opportunity to comply, but will follow up with the headteacher if the situation doesn't improve.

In cases where it is suspected that financial hardship has resulted in a pupil not complying with this uniform policy, staff will take a mindful and considerate approach to resolving the situation. The pastoral team will work with families to offer the best support.

Governors

The governing board will review this policy and make sure that it:

- is appropriate for our school's context
- is implemented fairly across the school
- considers the views of parents and pupils
- offers a uniform that is appropriate, practical and safe for all pupils

The board will also make sure that the school's uniform supplier arrangements give the highest priority to cost and value for money, for example by avoiding single supplier contracts and by re-tendering contracts at least every 5 years.



Monitoring arrangements

This policy will be reviewed annually by Miss Le Marinel, Headteacher. At every review, it will be approved by the full governing board.
