JOINING THE CROMPTON HOUSE TRUST UPDATE:

All consultations with stakeholders were completed before Christmas. The next stage is to seek approval from Manchester Diocese to move forwards with the application to join Crompton House Multi Academy Trust. This meeting has now been scheduled for 10th February. Once this approval has been granted the next stage will be a submission to the Department of Education. As you can see this is a long process and I will keep you updated throughout each stage. In the meantime, Crompton House are already inviting St Mary's to Trust Events which we are delighted to be able to participate in. For Instance, St Mary's will join other Church Primary Schools in the Trust and attend the Year 6 Leavers' Service at Manchester Cathedral together. We have also accepted an invite to join the Trust for events supporting 'The National Year of Reading'. These events enable us to begin to strengthen our relationship with the Crompton House Trust and enjoy the opportunities this brings for our pupils.

WELCOME LUNCH:

In September our pupil Department for Vision and Values made a pledge to:

- Strengthen connections with elderly community members.
- Build bridges between school and local parish.
- Promote intergenerational understanding and respect

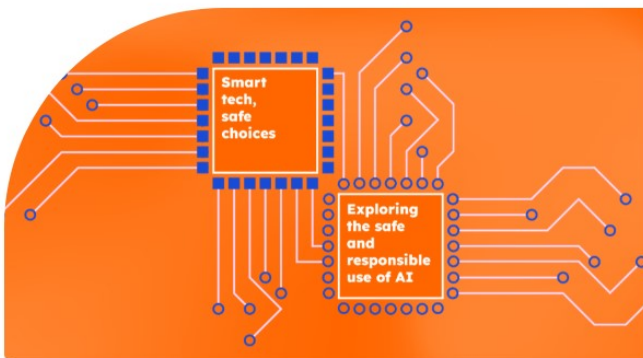

This year's theme is "This is My Place": Encourages schools, families, and communities to create environments where children feel they belong, are welcomed, and valued. During Children's Mental Health Week, we will revisit the 5 ways to Mental Health and Wellbeing :



Throughout the week there will be a range of activities at break times and lunchtimes for pupils to engage with. These activities will be led by our Health Champions and Sports Ambassadors. In addition, on **Friday 13th February** we will finish the week with a **non-uniform day** to make our very own 'Rainbow Friday' in school. Pupils are invited to send a voluntary donation of £1:00 donation, these funds will be used to purchase additional resources to support mental health in school.

On Friday the 13th we will also be running a **Mental Health and Wellbeing Afternoon** for all pupils to participate in. Once again, the activities will focus on the 5 areas and will include : Lego Building - to connect with others; a Nature Walk - to take notice, Exploring and Experiencing a Taste of France - to keep learning, Creating a Wave of Hands to welcome people into St Mary's Church - as part of giving , and dance, yoga and fitness - to keep active. 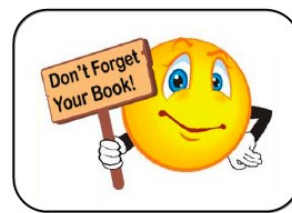
of World Book Day:
