



In writing, we will be looking at the text 'Beowulf' by Michael Morpurgo. We will discuss legends and the importance of heroic poetry. Children will create an epic, heroic narrative using various poetic devices.

In reading, we will look at a variety of non fiction texts alongside 'Floodland' by Marcus Sedgewick. We will focus on the VIPERS reading domains.

Maths

In maths, we will work on place value. This will start with identifying, comparing and ordering numbers, before then moving onto Roman numerals and rounding. We will spend time looking at written methods for multiplication and division too.





R.E.


During R.E., we will be considering why values are important to people of faith. Children will identify and explore the values at the heart of different faiths.



History




In history, we will be looking at the Anglo Saxons and Scots through the lens of hierarchy and power.



Science

In science, we are examining the power of forces. We investigate forces such as friction, air resistance and gravity.





P.S.H.E.

During P.S.H.E., we will be thinking about heathy relationships - thinking specifically about manners, good friendships and bullying.



Throughout our music learning, we will be looking at adapting and transposing motifs.

In French, we will be considering how to present ourselves. We will build on previous learning to talk about where we live and our nationality.

Computing

Throughout our computing learning we will be planning, creating and evaluating our own animations.
