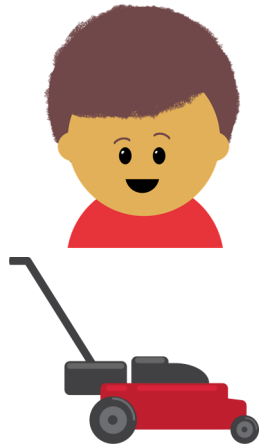

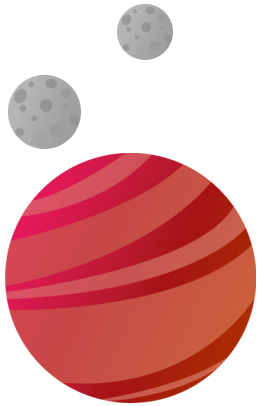

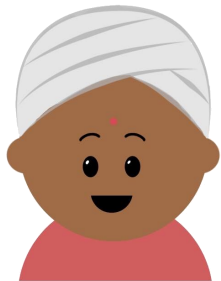
REASONING 1

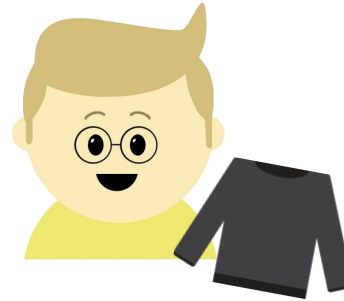

Alfie says he has underlined a determiner in his sentence.

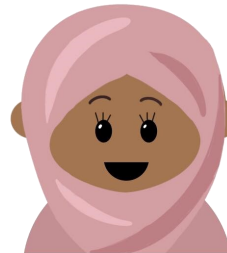


That isn't my jumper. It's his.
