Lower Key Stage 2 Autumn 2025 Newsletter

Welcome to the Autumn Term of 2025! Our Lower KS2 teaching team is Mr Lewis (Gatcombe) and Mrs Baxter (Coopers) in Year 4 with Mrs Soughton (Coker) and Miss Swinson (Kingston) in Year 3. The TA team for this year is made up of Mrs Brittain (mainly Gatcombe), Mrs Brister (mainly Coopers), Mrs Robson (mainly Kingston) and Mrs Samways (mainly Coker). There are also other adults working with specific children.

Reading and Times Tables Expectations

All children are expected to read at home at least five times per week. Their Reading Records need to be signed on each occasion - these will be checked weekly. Children have the opportunity to read in an 'open to all' reading club each morning break time and at both breakfast and after school club. These all count towards those five weekly occasions as the child chooses to do this. All children will be given a reading book at school at an appropriate level for their ability, but they are welcome to read any book of their choosing at home. We also use our school library to supplement this. Some children will have a specialist phonics book (has 7+ in the top corner) that relate to their phonics sessions.

20 is plenty!

Children who read for 20 minutes a day...

Will have a world of imagination & creativity opened to them

Will improve critical thinking skills

Will have a broad vocabulary

Will learn how to develop empathy

Will improve their communication skills

The children are also expected to practise their times

tables at home for approximately 20 minutes each week. Times tables knowledge is vital in Lower Key Stage 2 as all children will take part in the Multiplication Tables Check in Year 4 - a nationwide government times tables assessment that takes place in the Spring term. By this point, the children are expected to know all the times tables facts up to 12 x 12. To be on track to achieve this, all children are expected to know their x2, x5, 10, x3, x4 and x8 times tables by the end of Year 3, whilst learning the rest in Year 4. Research shows that 21 minutes is the magic number to practise at home per week to help facts stick – this is just 3 minutes per day! If your child does not have internet access at home, please let your class teacher know so that we can arrange an alternative activity. All children will have access to TT Rockstars and this will be tracked and certificates awarded.

PE

Please see below for each class PE days. This can sometimes change and will be communicated via Dojo. PE kits are worn for the day and need to be a **white shirt and plain dark shorts/trousers / leggings with school jumper/cardigan**. Long hair must be tied up and earrings must be removed on both PE days for Health & Safety. During the first half of Autumn Term, we will be swimming.

Personal Belongings

Time Out

To ensure the best learning environment for all children, there will be a 'Time Out' club at breaktime each day. Children who demonstrate low-level poor behaviour choices may be asked to stay behind at 'Time Out' as a consequence, to spend some time considering making better choices. We will write in their Reading Record or dojo if your child has been sent to Time Out and keep a record in school too. Higher level behaviours will always be communicated to yourself either in person or via Dojo.
