

Maths: Each maths lesson will consist of a 20-minute arithmetic session where we will practise our calculations and number skills. After this, we will then use these skills and apply them to solve problems. Our focus this term is revising all our key learning from previous terms and being able to reason and apply this learning to solving problems. Key areas for revision are:

- Number and Place Value
- Addition and Subtraction
- Multiplication and Division
- Fractions, Decimals and Percentages.
- Ratio and proportion.
- Shape
- Measures



RE:

Our first topic is ‘witness’ Pentecost – serving, having the courage to be a witness and the power of the Holy spirit. Next we study - Healing – looking after the vulnerable, sacrament of the sick. Our final topic is about the world- Common Good – Christians taking action as part of our call to be stewards of creation.



Science:

Y5 – Forces and living things and habitats – animal life cycles.

Y6 – Environment- Living Things and Habitats – Classification Animal/Health- Exercise, Health and Circulatory System

English: We aim to explore many new texts during our English and Guided Reading lessons. We will use these to explore the various themes within the text, looking at the features and analysing. History: Our History topic this term, will focus on a non-European society that provides contrasts with British history –Mayan civilization c. AD 900

Geography: We will be studying North and South America – (environmental regions, key physical and human characteristics, countries and major cities).

Art/DT: Making and decorating beanbag rainforest creatures. Artist’s Focus- Renate Müller

Computing: This term our focus will be understanding binary.
